Stay in a small, family-run jungle cabaña and discover rivers, forest trails, canopy viewpoints, and wildlife-rich clay licks with an expert local guide. Observe monkeys, macaws, and nocturnal creatures, and connect with Waorani families to learn about their ancestral traditions. An exclusive and immersive Amazon experience in a short yet powerful expedition.

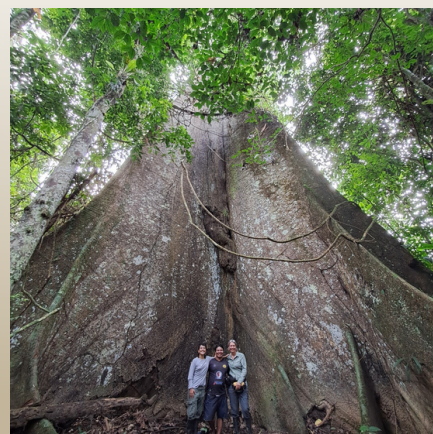

THE MAJESTIC GIANT CEIBO TREE

Discover a majestic ancient Ceibo tree deep within Yasuní National Park — accessible only on our tour. An awe-inspiring natural monument and one of the most spectacular photo moments of the journey.

YOUR DAILY ITINERARY



DAY 1

Departure at 10.00 from Coca with a stop for lunch at a riverside restaurant. After registration and a short introduction to the Yasuní National Park and the surrounding communities, the canoe is loaded and the 3–4 hours navigation deep into the rainforest begins.

During the journey, wildlife observation is possible, including monkeys, toucans, turtles, numerous bird species, and occasionally pink river dolphins.

Arrival at the remote cabaña around 18:00, welcome and room assignment (private bathrooms), time to relax surrounded by pristine jungle, followed by dinner.

In the evening, optional night walk to observe frogs, insects, tarantulas, and with luck, snakes.

DAY 2

Breakfast at 07:30.

Morning hike to a canopy viewpoint, offering breathtaking panoramic views over the endless rainforest, followed by a visit to a parrot clay lick, where parrots, macaws, the white curassow, and other wildlife can often be observed.

Return to the lodge for lunch and relaxation in hammocks or by the river.

In the afternoon, private paddling excursion along the river with opportunities to observe birds, turtles, toucans, and sloths.



DAY 3

Early birdwatching excursion at 05:30, experiencing the magical moment when the rainforest awakens.

Breakfast at 07:30.

Guided jungle walk focusing on wildlife observation, medicinal plants, traditional handicrafts, and demonstrations of how indigenous people climb trees to harvest forest products.

Lunch at 13:00, followed by rest time in hammocks.

In the afternoon, paddling to a river sandbank, with the opportunity to swim and wash hair using traditional plant-based jungle shampoo while observing macaws, parrots, monkeys, and other wildlife.

Enjoy the sunset over the river, return to the lodge, and dinner.





DAY 4

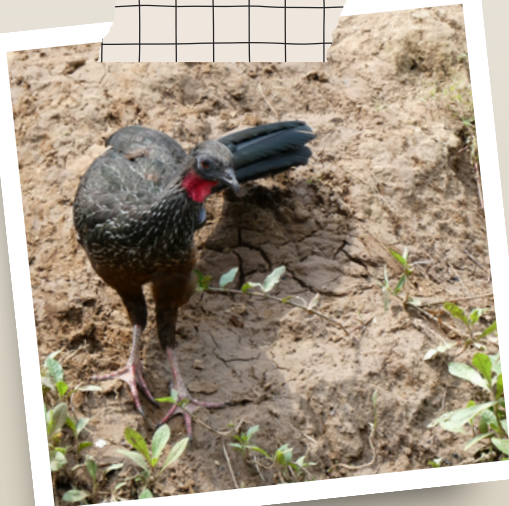
Day 4 – Waorani Community Visit & Return
Breakfast at 07:30, packing, and departure.

On the way back, stop at a giant Ceibo tree, followed by a visit to a Waorani family community within the Yasuní National Park. Visit a traditional house built from wood and palm leaves and learn about their culture, including:

- Traditional blowgun shooting
- Spear-throwing techniques
- Demonstration of how to make fire using ancestral methods without matches

Continue to the road, arriving around 12:30, followed by the transfer back to Coca. Have lunch in a restaurant.

Estimated arrival in Coca at approximately 16:00.

Daily activities may vary from the program depending on the weather, river conditions, canoes, or the preferences of the group.

WHAT TO BRING

To ensure a safe and comfortable experience in the Amazon Rainforest, please make sure to bring the following items:

- Original passport (required for entry into the reserve)
- Long-sleeved T-shirts (for sun and insect protection)
- Regular T-shirts
- Cotton socks, Shorts, Lightweight trousers or pants
- Swimsuit and towel
- Light, waterproof windbreaker or rain jacket
- Comfortable sandals or walking shoes
- Hat or cap (for sun protection)
- Sunglasses with a strap
- Small waterproof daypack
- Insect repellent (highly recommended with DEET or natural alternative)
- Sunscreen (high SPF)
- Sunburn relief lotion (e.g., aloe vera)
- Flashlight or headlamp with spare batteries
- Camera with extra batteries or charger
- Binoculars (for wildlife spotting)
- Zip-lock or dry bags (to protect electronics and documents)
- Basic first aid kit (personal medications, plasters, antiseptic, etc.
- Waterbottle



IMPORTANT FACTS ABOUT YOUR TRIP

The Yasuni National Park is one of the most biodiverse places on the planet and a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, home to thousands of plant species and incredible wildlife including pink river dolphins, giant otters, colorful macaws, and even jaguars. Located in the heart of the Ecuadorian Amazon, this pristine rainforest offers travelers an unforgettable experience of nature at its purest. Fun fact: scientists have recorded more tree species in one hectare of Yasuni than in all of North America! For a successful trip, pack light breathable clothing, waterproof gear, insect repellent, and binoculars for wildlife spotting. Keep an open mind, be patient, and let the jungle reveal its magic at its own rhythm.

NOT INCLUDED

The maximum walking time will be approximately three hours at a time. Please keep in mind that the name "Rainforest" comes from the significant amount of rainfall it receives—up to 4,000 mm (about 12 feet) annually. Rain can occur at any time, so come prepared. Our paddling canoes, designed for three people, are very stable and ideal for a safe and enjoyable experience on the water.

Our motorized canoes are comfortable, equipped with two seats per row, each with cushions for your comfort. These canoes do not have roofs, so be prepared for potential rain during navigation.



Your luggage will be protected from rainwater, and throughout all canoe journeys, you'll have access to cold drinks. Our Aguas Negras River Lodge and campsites are located on the banks of the river, minimizing the need to carry equipment over long distances. However, you should be prepared to carry your own luggage for short distances. We also ask that everyone assist in setting up the campsites, promoting a shared and immersive jungle experience. This itinerary takes you through the most pristine and remote parts of the Cuyabeno Reserve.

Over the five-day trip, we will travel approximately 200 kilometers, mostly by river. To reach this incredible destination, we must first drive through areas with oil infrastructure, secondary forests, and farmland. Once we enter the protected zone.
